## NURSING NOTES

Today, instead of telling you what not to eat, I am going to encourage you to eat...garlic and onions. The downside of this has always been bad breath but scientists are now discovering a possible upside to these pungent vegetables, besides spicy flavor. Onions and garlic may help protect against a wide range of cancers. In studies both onions and garlic were linked to significant reductions in the risk of colorectal, ovarian, prostate, breast, renal, esophageal, oral cavity, and throat cancers. Garlic was especially associated with large risk reductions; those consuming the most garlic showed a 25-88% reduced risk, depending on the type of cancer, compared to those eating less. Risk reductions for onion consumption ranged from 10-57% for the highest intake group. So enjoy plenty of onion and garlic, they may help reduce your risk of cancer.

Cornell University Center for Women's Health says if you have arthritic knees, walking barefoot could help. So slip off your shoes and go barefoot.

## EUCHARIST

"The 'breaking of bread'—as the Eucharist was called in earliest times—has always been at the centre of the Church's life. Through it Christ makes present within time the mystery of his death and resurrection. In it he is received in person as the 'living bread come down from heaven' (Jn 6:51), and with him we receive the pledge of eternal life and a foretaste of the eternal banquet of the heavenly Jerusalem." —Pope John Paul II, in his apostolic letter *Stay With Us Lord*, #3

"With the entire tradition of the Church, we believe that Jesus is truly present under the Eucharistic species. This presence—as Pope Paul VI rightly explained—is called 'real' not in an exclusive way, as if to suggest that other forms of Christ's presence are not real, but par excellence, because Christ thereby becomes substantially present, whole and entire, in the reality of his body and blood. Faith demands that we approach the Eucharist fully aware that we are approaching Christ himself." —Pope John Paul II, in his apostolic letter *Stay With Us Lord*, #16

## CATHOLIC DICTIONARY

**CHALICE.** The cup-shaped vessel or goblet used at Mass to contain the Precious Blood of Christ. For centuries it was made of precious material; if it was not of gold, the interior of the cup was gold-plated. Since the Second Vatican Council, chalices may be of other materials.

**CIBORIUM.** A covered container used to hold the consecrated small Hosts. It is similar to a chalice but covered and larger, used for small Communion hosts of the faithful. It is made of

various precious metals, and the interior is commonly gold or gold-plated.

**COMMUNICANT.** One who receives Holy Communion. The term also applies to all faithful and active members of a church, as distinct from merely nominal Catholics.

**HOST.** A victim of sacrifice, and therefore the consecrated Bread of the Eucharist considered as the sacrifice of the Body of Christ. The word is also used of the round wafers used for consecration.

**PATEN.** A saucerlike dish of the same material as the chalice ö gold-plated and consecrated by a bishop or his delegate with holy chrism. It must be large enough to cover the chalice. On it rests the bread to be consecrated, and later on the Sacred Host.

**PURIFICATOR.** A small piece of white linen, marked with a cross in the center, used by the priest in the celebration of Mass. It is folded in three layers and used by the priest to purify his fingers and the chalice and paten after Holy Communion.
